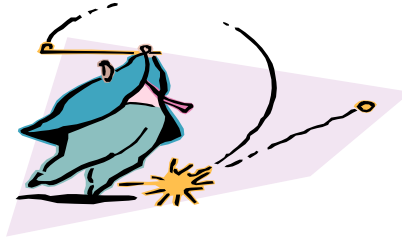

SE Practice Act

The SEAOC State Board has been working diligently on developing a policy statement making the case for the enactment of a Structural Engineering Practice Act. I am pleased to announce that the statement is finalized and the SEAOSC Board has unanimously voted in favor of it. This is a first step in starting the process of advocating for the adoption of such an act. Next steps include contacting State legislators to present to them the need for such an act and to solicit their support. I am including some excerpts here – If you need the full text, you can obtain it from the SEAOC web site.

“...SEAOC strongly urges the State of California (CA) to adopt a Structural Engineering Practice Act (SEPA) that defines the practice of structural engineering and restricts it to those who have demonstrated competence by means of education, experience, and examination.

... with the advance of knowledge and innovation over the years, the field of structural engineering has grown increasingly complex. Its practice requires specialization and continued education in the application of latest building codes, standards, specifications and methods. A higher standard is required, if practitioners are to hold to their mission of protecting the safety, health, and welfare of all Californians. Furthermore, California has particular need for increased resilience in our built structures and infrastructure. Much of the state is at high seismic risk, and resilience-based seismic design – a unique qualification of Structural Engineers -- helps to ensure the safety of building occupants,

limit repair costs, and reduce the time for structures to regain function following moderate-to-major earthquakes.

Other states currently set full or partial structural engineering practice restrictions, including Illinois, Utah, Nevada, and our colleague states on the Pacific Rim: Hawaii, Washington and Oregon. The National Council of Structural Engineers Associations (NCSEA), the Council of American Structural Engineers (CASE), the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE), as well as its Structural Engineering Institute (SEI), all strongly support separate licensure for Structural Engineers.

California's Structural Engineering Practice Act should have the following elements:

The CA SEPA shall incorporate threshold criteria for those structures that may be deemed exempt from SEPA restrictions.

The CA SEPA will continue to require that a Structural Engineer first be licensed as a California Civil Engineer. For CA, the examination for Structural Engineering licensure will continue to be The NCEES 16-hour Structural Engineering examination.

Currently licensed Civil Engineers who practice structural engineering can continue in their current scopes of practice. At a specific date in the future, all new engineers who seek to practice structural engineering must obtain SE licensure. Structural Engineers seeking to maintain their licensure shall complete continuing education requirements for both their Civil and Structural Engineers licenses.”

Board Approves New Associate Member Categories

The SEAOSC Board of Directors approved the establishment of subcategories of Associate membership to include the following based on the individual's Bachelor of Science or Masters of Science graduation date:

First year after graduation: \$50	(AS 1)
2nd year after graduation: \$75	(AS 2)
3rd year after graduation: \$100	(AS 3)
4th year after graduation: \$125	(AS 4)
5th year after graduation: \$140	(AS)

These new membership categories are approved with the following understandings:

- (1) The new fee schedule is to be for new members joining the Association.
- (2) There are to be no reimbursements for existing Associate members.
- (3) The new fee schedule will be implemented with the next dues cycle starting July 1, 2012.
- (4) Candidates may elect to join using the date of either their BS or MS but each candidate is entitled to such discounted rate only once and the election needs to be declared right after graduation.

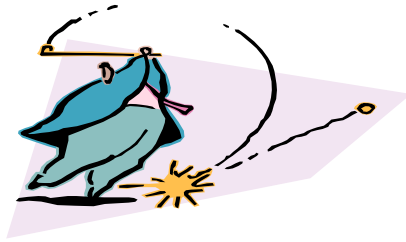
